Major themes from this month:

Tone: Performing with a clear and resonant sound

Technique: Performing with proper right and left hand technique, posture and playing position.

Dynamics: Students in all grades have focused on expanding their dynamic range and how to adjust accordingly their bow weight, speed, and placement.

Rhythm: Rhythm will be a continued focus throughout the school year. Students will continue to grow their understanding on how to count a variety of rhythms

Expression: Students in all grades have continued to develop their understanding and abilities in musical expression. This is going beyond notes and rhythms with things such as dynamics, phrasing, and vibrato.
