Spooky Composition

As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, East orchestra will dedicate time to music composition this year. All students had their first composition activity last week, Thursday (Halloween). This was first in a twelve part composition series.

After watching two different versions of the introduction to *The Shining*, students had one class period to create their own soundtrack. And the results were very spooky! This activity focuses on using music to communicate an idea and gets students more accustomed to composing using notation software. The assignment also deemphasizes the need for structured melody/harmony and instead places a greater emphasis on texture and mood.

Be sure to ask your student about their piece. And ask to listen!
